✓ An introduction of Balochistan Human Rights Group (BHRG)

Balochistan Human Rights Group (BHRG) is independent and non-profit human rights Non-Governmental Organization (NGO), that works on providing information to fill the gaps cause by the lack of independent media in Balochistan through investigation, effective communication and gathering reliable documents.

BHRG provides relevant, verified and up-to date information regarding the human rights situation in Western Balochistan.

✓ Execution of Baloch Prisoners

In June 2025, at least Nine Baloch prisoners were executed. Their identities are Abdolsamad Brahui (25), Rahim Rigi (32), Abdolbasat Shahdadzehe (25), Hossein Behzadi (38), Hamid Shirzai, Nadim Davoudi, Jomeh Sabeghi (30), Fakhrullah Shiruzehe (30), and Ebrahim Lajhi (35). According to the annual report of the Balochistan Human Rights Group for 2024, at least 111 Baloch prisoners were executed on various charges across different cities in Iran, with Zahedan Prison recording 27 cases, Birjand Prison 13 cases, and Yazd Prison 14 cases, marking the highest number of executions.

✓ Extrajudicial Killing

In June 2025, at least four Baloch citizens, including one woman, were killed due to direct shooting by the security forces of the Islamic Republic of Iran. The identities of the victims are Hosniyeh Kolkali (40), Hassan Afzali (30), Ali Isafak, and Mohammad Reza Mazari.

✓ Baloch Detainees

In June 2025, at least eight Baloch citizens were detained, identified as Farhad Khiya (23), Mohsen Dashti, Osama Bilrani (16), Mohammad Reza Habibinejad (28), Rahmatollah Shahbakhsh, Abdulhamid Hashemzehe, and Shabir Bartaj (26). According to the Balochistan Human Rights Group, these individuals represent only a portion of the detainees, as the actual number of detentions is higher. Many Baloch families refrain from reporting arrests due to fear of the Islamic Republic or warnings from security forces against publicizing such incidents.

✓ **Fuel Carriers**

In June 2025, at least 8 Baloch fuel carriers lost their lives and 5 were injured. According to the annual report of the Balochistan Human Rights Group, in 2024, a total of 479 fuel carriers were killed or injured due to road accidents, shootings by military forces, attacks by unidentified armed individuals, landmine explosions, fires, and drowning. Of these, 253 were killed and 226 were injured.
